It is our special 21st Annual Workshop this year, and we are very fortunate that we can mark the occasion with a full platform of excellent speakers. Foremost is Dr Dennis Carlton from the University of Chicago who we are delighted to have as our keynote speaker, speaking on the "Use and Misuse of Empirical Methods in Antitrust". Dr Carlton focuses his research on microeconomics, industrial organization and antitrust, and has published more than eighty articles and two books (one of which is a leading text). He is also the co-editor of the *Journal of Law and Economics* and of *Competition Policy International.* From 2006 to 2008 he served as the Deputy Assistant Attorney General for Economic Analysis in the Antitrust Division of the US Department of Justice, and is currently Senior Managing Director of Compass Lexecon Inc. He is the recipient of a large number of awards for his research, and has given keynote addresses in conferences in a number of countries. Professor Lew Evans from the School of Economics and Finance at Victoria University of Wellington will act as Commentator on his paper

We are also very privileged to have the Honourable Justice John Fogarty (High Court of New Zealand) to speak on "Running the Mischief Rule over Appellate Decisions Trans-Tasman". The fourth session will address the counterfactuals in merger analysis and in section 36 of the Commerce Act 1986., and John Land will act as Commentator for that session.

The sixth and final session addresses experience with input methodologies in the regulation of the electricity industry, with Nathan Strong from Unison as the Speaker, and Ross Young from the Commerce Commission as his Commentator.

This year's Workshop features two panel discussions. Session three will deal with the very hot topic of the moment – the criminalization of hard-core cartels. Our panellists include Dr Beaton-Wells from the Melbourne Law School, Nick Flanagan from Meredith Connell, Paul Scott from the Victoria University Law School, and Victoria Heine from Chapman Tripp. Session five discusses whether the Commerce Act can handle two-sided markets, using credit cards as a case study. The panellists include Dr Dennis Carlton (our Keynote Speaker), Dr Rhonda Smith from the University of Melbourne, Stephen Gale from Castalia, and Jenny Stevens from Bell Gully.

And for our entertainment at the Workshop dinner (at the prestigious White House in Oriental Bay), our After-Dinner Speaker is Professor Tim Hazledine from the University of Auckland.
